KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

Morning: DR. GALIT KLEINER-FISMAN

Parkinson's disease; more than just a movement disorder
Dr. Kleiner-Fisman went to medical school at McGill trained in Neurology at Harvard in Boston. She completed her movement disorders fellowship in Toronto at U of T. Faculty at University of Pennsylvania where she was the Clinical Director of the PADRECC (parkinson's disease research, education and clinical center) in Philadelphia. Currently an assistant professor of medicine division of Neurology and practices at Toronto Western and Baycrest where she runs the Movement Disorders Clinic.

Afternoon: DR. NAOMI VISANJJI

Received her Honours BSc in Neuroscience at the University of Nottingham in the UK in the Department of Biomedical Science. She completed her PhD in Pharmacology at the University of London. From 2004-2007 she was a Post Doctoral Fellow at the Toronto Western Research Institute. Dr. Visanji is currently training under the supervision of Dr. Anurag Tandon at the University of Toronto.

[A1/B1] MINDFULNESS MEDITATION AND IMAGERY PRACTICES FOR PEOPLE WITH PD AND THEIR CAREGIVERS

Theresa Moore, RN MScN is a Clinical Nurse at the Centre for Movement Disorders in Markham. She is a Recognized Practitioner and Teacher of Therapeutic Touch™, has studied and practiced mindfulness meditation and imagery.

[A2/B2] THE ALEXANDER TECHNIQUE AS A TOOL FOR MANAGING PD

Tanya Bénard. Come discover how the Alexander Technique can offer strategies for coping with the various challenges of PD. This workshop will include an introduction to the Technique, discussion of how it relates to PD, as well as a brief look at the research that has been done.
